

LATEST UPDATE – SEPTEMBER 24, 2021

In an effort to keep our community partners connected, we are providing you with regular COVID-19 updates.

COVID-19 vaccine update

As of Sept. 24, 87.5% of eligible people 12 and older in B.C. have received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine and 80.0% received their second dose. Since December 2020, the Province has administered 7,771,314 doses of Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna and AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccines.

Ministry of Health update

In the Sept. 24 statement on B.C.'s COVID-19 response, 743 new cases were reported with 111 of those in the Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH) area.

The total number of people who have tested positive for COVID-19 in B.C. now stands at 182,541 since the start of the pandemic. There are 5,979 active cases of COVID-19 across B.C. currently.

Seven new COVID-19 related death were recorded, while 319 people are currently hospitalized, with 149 of these cases receiving treatment in ICU/critical care. The total number of individuals who have passed away due to COVID-19 is 1,922.

A reminder that people can get their BC Vaccine Card online at gov.bc.ca/vaccinecard. Once verified, a person will be able to save a digital copy to their mobile device or print a hard copy to present along with their government-issued photo identification when entering designated businesses and events.

People without access to a computer can get their card from a Service BC Centre or by calling 1 833 838-2323 at the Get Vaccinated call centre.

Safety of COVID-19 vaccines and pregnancy

Dr. Bonnie Henry, Provincial Health Officer, [addressed concerns](#) regarding vaccinations for those planning to get pregnant, or if they are pregnant or breast-feeding.

COVID-19 vaccines have been recommended by the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists here in Canada, by the National Advisory Committee on Immunization, and by similar groups around the world. All vaccines that are approved for use in Canada are not only safe, but recommended for people who are pregnant, people who are thinking of getting pregnant, and people who are breast-feeding.

COVID-19 notification in school settings

Dr. Henry also [announced](#) that parents, families and staff will be notified of COVID-19 exposures in their school. She assured parents that if their child has been exposed to COVID-19, they will be notified. She pointed out it does take time to follow up on each individual case and that sometimes can take longer than expected.

VCH continues to operate several mass-vaccination and pop-up clinics across the region. For a full list of VCH vaccination clinics, including pop-up clinics, please visit <http://www.vch.ca/vaccine>.

All clinics are accepting drop-ins for first and second doses. All are welcome at our clinics, including those without personal health numbers and people who are not residents of B.C. Clinic staff are available to help people register and book appointments at other clinics throughout the region, if needed, and can help answer any vaccine-related questions. All residents are encouraged to still [register on the provincial system](#) to ensure they receive an alert once they are eligible to book their second dose vaccination.

VCH immunization team onboard with their vaccine mission

In August, a small team of immunizers from Vancouver Coastal (VCH) had been boarding the giant freighters that dot English Bay and Vancouver Harbour with the mission to immunize as many seafarers with the COVID-19 vaccine as possible.

Since the campaign began, the team had embarked 10 ships, immunizing 120 sailors and crew members from across the globe including, the Philippines, China, Korea, India and Ukraine. "To be able to deliver a vaccine that is so remarkably safe and effective to these people who are so grateful and excited to receive it, it's just awesome," said Paul Maximus, a member of the seafaring vaccine team. Paul noted that these ships have often bounced from port-to-port with Canada being the only country offering the vaccine to crew.
