Sometimes you have to push boundaries to advance medical science.

That is exactly what Dr. Eric Yoshida, a principal investigator with Vancouver Coastal Health Research Institute and the former medical director of the BC Liver Transplant Program, and his team did in 2021 when they successfully completed an orthotopic liver transplant into a

worldwide. The <u>resulting case report</u> published in the August 2021 edition of *Transplant Direct* filled a knowledge void for clinicians whose COVID-19positive patients urgently required transplants. Previously, clinicians would not have attempted transplant surgery in this circumstance due to the lack of published scientific literature on the subject.


