Overview of VCH Prevention Services



Child & Youth

Adult

In collaboration with Population Health & Health Protection, work with partners in various settings (e.g. schools, local gov't, non profit) to implement evidence-based upstream, preventative policies and programs.

✓ PHNs and Dietitians support health promotion initiatives in schools using the Comprehensive School Health Framework.

PRENATAL

✓ All pregnant people are offered standardized screening, health promotion and education, and intervention including referral as needed. Priority populations will be offered public health services and/or referral. <u>http://www.vch.ca/public-health/pregnancy-parenting/pregnancy</u>

- ✓ Universal health promotion and prevention messaging to the public.
- ✓ Refer clients to optometry resources in the community.
- ✓ Seek partnerships with FNHA, First Nations, and rural communities to address gaps in service accessibility.

AUDIOLOGY

- ✓ Provides newborn hearing screening at birth hospital.
- ✓ Hearing screening offered at Kindergarten.
- Hearing assessments are provided to children 0-19 years of age upon referral.
- $\checkmark~$ Hearing aid fittings for children 0-19 years of age



- ✓ Pediatric team Occupational and Physio Therapist provide services to children with chronic health and special needs.
- Nursing Support Services, funded and under mandate of Provincial Health Services provide care for children with medical complexities.

EARLY YEARS: MATERNAL

- Public Health Nurses (PHNs) make an initial contact with parents of newborn within 24 to 48 hours of birth notification from maternity care provider.
- ✓ PHNs assess maternal & newborn stability, assess variances from normal outcomes, and plan followup. On call Nurse: 604-983-6754

SCHOOL-AGE IMMUNIZATIONS

- ✓ Vaccines administered in schools to Kindergarten, Grade 6 and Grade 9 students in public, private and First Nations schools in VCH.
- ✓ Public Health Clinic based immunizations offered in addition. There is an Public Health Nurse attached to each school to coordinate this service, for more information: 604-983-6714.

IMMUNIZATION & VACCINATION PROGRAM

- ✓ Provide clinical support, resources & education for VCH immunization programs.
- ✓ Order and organize distribution of vaccines, track and monitor inventory, and provide cold chain education and support.



- Speech and Language Pathologists assess, diagnose and treat communication disorders to enable children to reach their maximum communication potential.

C + EARLY YEARS: UNVERSAL AND ENHANCED

- ✓ Following birth notification and through other referral pathway, all families can be provided with PHN supports for health promotion, prevention and capacity building.
- ✓ PHNs will continue to provide intensive supports and services to priority population.

DENTAL

✓ Hygienist services include risk assessment (oral & non oral risk factors for decay are assessed by dental hygienist), dental screening, oral health information (hygiene, nutrition, and general counselling), fluoride varnish application, and referral. 604-983-6700



✓ Dietitians provide support to PHNs and community professionals/leaders on best practice and policy related to food/nutrition via consultations, clinics, and workshops.



- Public Health provides Immunizations according to the BC Immunization Guide for children (2, 4, 6, 12, 18 months, and 4-6 year olds).

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

- ✓ Provide clinical support, resources and education for prevention and control of CDs in VCH.
- ✓ CD nurses support case, contact and outbreak management for vaccine preventable diseases, viral respiratory infections and sexually transmitted and blood borne infections. Questions: 604- 983-6714

SEXUAL HEALTH & YOUTH CLINIC

- ✓ Services for youth include health education, counselling, provision of contraception and emergency contraception, pregnancy diagnosis and options counselling, testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections, immunizations and referrals.
- ✓ Strategic planning to support equitable access to sexual health and reproductive services, collaborative engagement with partners across the region, and innovative opportunities for sexual health promotion.
