Transportation Resources



HandyDart?

- HandyDART is a door-to-door, <u>shared-ride</u> service
- It is a specially-equipped vehicle for passengers with disabilities
- You must be registered to use this service
- Medical certification is required
- Visitor applications are available

HandyCard

- Allows travel at concession rates on the bus, SkyTrain, SeaBus and West Coast Express
- All Zones \$1.75 per trip OR \$52 for a monthly pass
- Attendants ride free!
- Registration is free
- Provide two pictures (1 1/4" x 1 1/4")
- Use the same form as HandyDart application
- Note: HandyCard can't be used on HandyDart

Taxi Saver Coupons

- Must be a HandyCard user
- Can purchase two \$25 packages (value: \$50) every month, but they give you \$100 in taxi vouchers
- The coupon amounts are \$1, \$2 and \$5
- Call Access Transit office to request order form: Access Transit office: (778) 452-2860
- Complete order form, include cheque and return by mail
- Note: let them know you will pay with taxi vouchers when you call to book

Public Transit



Public Transit

- The Bus, SkyTrain, SeaBus and West Coast Express is accessible to people of <u>all</u> abilities
- Buses come equipped with ramps and lifts, and all SkyTrain stations have elevators
- Every bus can carry two wheelchairs
- Use your HandyCard to pay concession rate fare and have your attendant ride free
- Wheelchair accessible stops: 604.953.3333
- Bus Training: 604.264.5420

Sparc BC Parking Permit

- Parking permit lasts 3 years
- Costs \$20
- Medical certification is required
- Forms can be submitted by mail
- Takes 3-6 weeks to process applications
- You can drop off your application at their Burnaby office and receive your placard right away
- Can park in Vancouver residential permit zones for 3 hours

Fuel Tax Rebate Program

- Medical certification required
- 1 claim per year is recommended
- Can claim every 4 years
- Only claim \$10- \$500 per year (no more, no less)
- letter of "ownership interest" is accepted when not the "registered" owner of a vehicle
- Include driver's license and vehicle registration documents with application
- Submit all original gas receipts with claim by December 31st each year.

ICBC Disability Discount

- 25% discount on your autoplan insurance
- Must be approved with the Fuel Tax Rebate Program in order to qualify
- Must be the registered owner of the vehicle
- If NOT the owner, spouse/partner can gift/transfer the ownership of vehicle into both parties names
- To avoid \$28 "transfer of ownership" fee, wait until vehicle insurance needs to be renewed

GST/PST Motor Vehicle Rebate

- Claim GST/PST on the purchase, or modification, of a "qualifying" vehicle (e.g. lift, ramp, adaptive driving control)
- Must apply for rebate within first 4 years of the paid tax
- leased vehicles that have been adapted also qualify
- Send all original receipts with claim

Tax Credits & Grants





Disability Tax Credit

- Non-refundable tax credit used to reduce payable income tax
- Who Qualifies?
 - Canadian citizens
 - Individuals with a severe and prolonged disability
 - A spouse, common-law partner or family member providing care

Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP) - For more info: ww.rdsp.com

- Registered matched savings plan specific for people with disabilities Every \$1 put in an RDSP account, federal government can match up to \$3 (if your family income is below \$87,123) → Canada Disability Savings Grant
- For people living on a low-income (< \$25,356), federal government will put in \$1,000 each year for 20 years →
 Canada Disability Savings Bond
- For people living on an income between \$25,3456-\$43,561, they can still receive partial bond
- Anyone can contribute to RDSP (families, friends, neighbours)
- Must be approved for the Disability Tax Credit

Home Owners Grant for person with disability

- Reduces amount of property tax you pay for your principal residence
- Grant is applied to amount of property taxes over \$100
- Home modifications (ramps, lifts, wheel-in-shower, bathroom bars, etc.) or homecare support required
- Must make claim by December 31st of the current year
- Medical certification needed

Property Tax Deferment

- Low-interest loan program
- Assists qualifying home owners with paying annual property taxes
- Must have medical certification or provide confirmation of person with disability (PwD) designation through the Ministry.
- Must be Canadian citizen living in BC at least 1 year

Home Adaptations for Independence HAFI

- BC Housing has a maximum \$20,000 grant available for people who need to modify their homes for accessibility purposes
- The grant does not need to be paid back, but must live in the house for 5 years from date of receiving grant
- To be eligible, your family income needs to fall within the income limits, and the house value needs to be within the assessed values for the area you live in
- Not available for subsidized rentals
- Available for landlords and tenants as well, income and rent need to qualify for your region
- BC Housing ask that you provide 3 different quotes from contractors along with your application

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Travel & Entertainment



BC Ferries Pass

- A discount for persons with a permanent disability and attendant to go for the price of one (2 for 1)
- If you have an "over height" vehicle, with a lift or ramp, you can pay the regular "car" tariff
- Priority boarding included with pass
- Medical certification required
- Pacific Coach Bus Lines will pay for a cab to take you to the ferry terminals if an accessible bus is not available after you had made arrangements.

Disability Travel Card

- Provided by Easter Seals Canada for persons with a permanent disability
- Provides discounts for person with permanent disability and their attendant (2 for 1)
- Accepted for discounts with Via Rail train, and coach Canada bus lines (Greyhound, Motor Coach Canada)
- Needs to be signed off by a health care provider
- Need to book a wheelchair lift 48 hours before traveling on any of the bus lines

Access 2 Entertainment Card

- Allows persons w disability to receive either free admission or a significant discount for their support person at selected movie theatres and attractions across Canada
- \$20 fee (2 years) or \$30 (3 years)
- Accepted at all major movie theatres in Canada
- Accepted at many local venues in Vancouver (Vancouver Aquarium)
