Influenza Vaccine Campaign 2019-2020: Bulletin #1

Thanks for supporting the annual influenza vaccination campaign, expected to start in early October. Please do not book clinics until you receive further details on vaccine availability.

Eligibility: There are no changes in the eligibility this year. Influenza vaccine is recommended for everybody, and provided free to individuals at high risk of complications and their caregivers/close contacts. This includes:

- Children 6-59 months
 People 5-64 years with underlying chronic health conditions
- Seniors

- Visitors to health care facilities
- Pregnant women
- Essential community service providers

Egg Allergy	People with severe egg allergy (including anaphylaxis) can be offered any influenza vaccine.	

Please Note: Flumist is not available this season, publically or privately, due to undisclosed decisions by Aztra Zeneca.

Influenza vaccine for seniors: Publicly funded vaccines for seniors include Fluviral[®] or Agriflu[®]; both are recommended by the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) for immunization of all ages. Another option for seniors is Fluzone HD[®], a high dose trivalent inactivated influenza vaccine.

Fluzone HD is licensed for those 65 years and older, and provides better protection for this age group against influenza and its complications. Additional details can be found in the <u>NACI statement on influenza vaccines</u>, or in the <u>BCCDC FAQ</u> <u>on Fluzone HD®</u>. Despite the lack of public funding, we recommend Fluzone HD be offered to those 65 years and older. Availability and cost may vary, but Fluzone HD® is available for purchase without prescription at select pharmacies and the VCH Travel Clinic (\$75).

Influenza vaccine ordering and distribution process: If your office received influenza vaccine last year, you do not need to place an order for this fall. When vaccine arrives, we will connect with your office to offer a start-up vaccine supply. New offices can call us to get registered for a start-up supply. **Re-orders** can be placed every 2-4 weeks based on anticipated vaccine demand within your clinic. Please use the office-specific Vaccine Request Form that will arrive with your start-up supply. Please keep copies of this form for the duration of the influenza season. Multi-group practices are requested to place an order for the entire group rather than by individual physicians. In order to ensure optimum vaccine performance, vaccine will not be released in the absence of adequate **cold chain supplies** (hard sided coolers, water blankets, ice packs).
