TAKE-HOME NALOXONE

TAKE-HOME NALOXONE (THN) KITS

When distributing kits to patients, ensure they are trained in overdose response.





KNOW THE SIGNS

Know the signs of suspected opioid overdose:



Not respondingDoesn't move and can't be woken.



Slow or no breathingA breath every 5 seconds is normal.



Making soundsChoking, gurgling sounds or snoring



Blue lips and nails



Cold or clammy skin



Tiny pupils

SAVE ME STEPS

Follow the **SAVE ME** steps below to respond.



Stimulate
Unresponsive? CALL 911.



AirwayCheck and open



1 breath every 5 seconds



EvaluateBreathing?



Medication
Inject 1 ml of naloxone
into a muscle.
Keep giving breaths.



Evaluate
Is another dose
needed?

HARM REDUCTION KITS

Harm Reduction Kits can be ordered via E-pro (People Soft): Smoking Kit Meth - Item ID 00142339; Smoking Kit Crack - Item ID 00142340; Injection Kit Single Use - Item ID 00142341; Injection Kit Mulit-Use - Item ID 00142663.

When prepping supplies into ready-to-go kits, items are packaged based on the route of consumption or use. Here is a list of supplies to be included in each kit.

Injection kit (Single use)

2 rigs/needles

1 sterile water

1 cooker with filters

1 sterifilter

2 alcohol swabs

1 vitamin C packets

1 cotton ball or spot band-aid

Injection kit (Multi-use)

5 rigs/needles

3 sterile waters

2 ties/tourniquets

3 cookers with filters

3 sterifilters

10 alcohol swabs

2 vitamin C packets

Cotton balls or spot band-aids

Smoking kit (meth)

1 bubble pipe

1 mouth piece

2 alcohol swabs

Smoking kit (crack)

2 straight pipes

2 mouth pieces

2 push sticks

2 alcohol swabs

Smoking – foil kit

5 pieces of foil

2 straight pipes

2 push sticks

Subcutaneous (SUB-Q) HRT kit

10 1 ml syringes

10 alcohol swabs

10 18G x 1 1/2" needle

10 25G x 5/8" needle



BAGGING AND LABELLING

- Paper bags are used to provide easy and discreet access.
 Supplies not included in the kit examples above are 3 ml syringes, paper straws, safer sex supplies and sharps containers. These can be made accessible in separate stacking bins next to the paper bag kits.
- To prevent breakage and movement of more fragile supplies (i.e., Pyrex pipes), secure supplies in a ziplock bag, then place them in a paper bag and label it.
