Before prescribing or providing OAT:



 Review PharmaNet (required).




Ask patient if they have any missed doses.



Contact usual pharmacy (if available).

General OAT information on Pharmanet

Medication name and strength 2. Quantity dispensed by pharmacist 3. Dates of the active prescription 4. Filled (indicates filled by the pharmacy) Note: The medication may be filled but NOT picked up yet. To confirm if the dose has been picked up, call the pharmacy. 5. Total daily dose




How to interpret PharmaNet for missed doses

- Dates when medication was dispensed: There may be days where no dispensing occurred, indicating missed days.
- Reversed: Indicates a missed dose. The pharmacies initially fill the dose, but
 if it is not picked up, the pharmacy "reverses" the fill (typically at the end
 of the work day, but occasionally at the start of the following work day).
- Buprenorphine/naloxone may be dispensed weekly.

Caution: A missed dose from today may appear as "filled" and not be reversed until the following morning.
