



Mental Health and Substance Use Supported Housing Services

What we do: In collaboration with service and housing providers we provide a continuum of **transitional supported housing programs** for individuals experiencing chronic mental health and substance use issues who require support within a housing model to maintain/continue their recovery.

Eligibility:

MHSH

- >19 years of age
- Homeless or are precariously housed
- Vancouver resident for the year prior to admission to acute or tertiary, if in hospital
- Have a diagnosis of a severe and persistent mental illness (e.g. schizophrenia)
- Be actively supported by a VCH Mental Health and/or Substance Use Team
- Must clinically require support in housing
- Have a funding source such as PWD etc.

CTT:

- As above, except CTT will accept homeless clients with under 1 year residency
- Receives referrals from psychiatric units at VGH/UBCH/SPH (approx.. 200 beds)

HOUSING FIRST:

- Provides low barrier, harm reduction housing for those who identify the DTES as their community
- Serves homeless individuals
- Receives referrals from Vancouver community inside and outside of health services

Access to Services

- 1. Consult with Intake Clinician each team has an intake Clinician
- 2. Referral will be opened when criteria is met

Housing Overview

Housing is considered transitional housing and is operated by contracted housing service providers. Fee subsidized and variable.
